Fridays at Five is a weekly one-hour concert that is live streamed at [SFJAZZ.org/watch](https://sfjazz.org/watch) from 5-6PM PT (7-8PM CT, 8-9PM ET), and is free to SFJAZZ members (\$5 monthly, or \$50/annually). Watch on your smart TV.

You can watch *Fridays at Five* on your smart TV by using your TV’s streaming app. See additional resources on Google Chromecast, Apple AirPlay, Roku, and other TV streaming apps in the [“Troubleshooting Tips”](#) section below.

Or watch on your mobile device.

You can watch or cast *Fridays at Five* from your mobile device by logging into your account and visiting the [Fridays at Five watch page](#).

You can also watch *Fridays at Five* via the YouTube mobile app. First, ensure that the app is installed on your mobile device. Once you’ve logged into your SFJAZZ account and [navigated to the Watch page](#), tap on the video title in the upper left hand corner of the video player. This will open the concert feed in the YouTube app.

Hang out in the chat.

Fridays at Five is an event best experienced as a part of a group—engage with fellow fans and the artists performing on screen by joining the chat. You’ll also get important context on the show and songs you’re viewing with helpful information delivered by the SFJAZZ chat moderator. **Chat is best experienced on desktop/laptop devices** and is located to the right of the video player (see screenshot below). The chat will also display on mobile below the video player.

Set your YouTube resolution to 1080 HD.

YouTube's default resolution for videos is 720p on desktop and 480p on mobile. If you have a strong internet connection, we recommend setting the livestream to 1080p HD. Click the Settings icon (⚙️) in the bottom right corner of the video player to change your resolution. Increasing your video resolution will also improve audio quality!

Troubleshooting Tips
